* Close contact is defined as face to face interaction of less than 6 feet for greater than 15 minutes at one time. Per CDC, "recommendations vary on the length of time of exposure, but 15 minutes of close exposure can be used as an operational definition. Brief interactions are less likely to result in transmission; however, symptoms and the type of interaction (e.g., did the infected person cough directly into the face of the exposed individual) remain important." REMINDER: Follow physical distancing guidelines:
